Introduction

Objectives of the dissemination activities:

- Informing the academic staff, SwD and students about the project objectives, outcomes and results after the first year of the project life;
- Informing the academic staff, SwD and students about the implemented activities and tasks so far, concerning work packages and dissemination activities
- Encouraging students to give their inputs and thoughts about the project and take part in future steps
- Discussing the ways to initiate cooperation between national employment services and faculties

Short description of activities

The second info-day was attended by around 15 participants: SwD, students, academic staff. It was organized at the Faculty of Philosophy, on Wednesday 12 October, 2016 in one of the faculty classrooms.

The second info-day was opened by the project coordinator for the University of East Sarajevo, prof. dr Biljana Sladoje Bošnjak, who welcomed all the participants and thanked them for their supportive involvement in this project dissemination activities. Doc. dr Vera Vujević greeted the participants and gave a short account of the dissemination activities in the last year of project life, informing them of the outcomes so far and of possible benefits project offers to students in particular.

Doc. dr Mirjana Samardžić gave a short summary of the project, and then spoke about the goals of the project and the dissemination and exploitation of project outcomes and results that are considered to be a very important activities for its successful implementation. Prof. dr Biljana Sladoje Bošnjak presented results of the previous research within the project (WP1).

Doc. dr Daliborka Škipina informed the participants about the activities of which were discussed at the last meeting held in Maribor; about the role and importance of mentors in hiring students with disabilities, and gave a description of mentor's job:

- Mentor must be trained to work on the webtools;
- Mentor must be trained on issues for the development of his career and work with other mentors;
- Mentor must do regular counselling and regularly update information in the database;
- Regular updates on the dissemination activities;



- Promotion of support services for students with disabilities;
- Connecting with career centers outside the university (public institutions);
- Monitoring the labor market;
- Attending the training for active job search;
- Providing training;
- Close contact with persons in employment agencies.

After all this was presented to the participants, teachers opened the discussion for the present students with disabilities and students of the fourth year of pedagogy and psychology. After the discussion, students took part in drafting a CV and finding the best way of presenting themselves to the potential employers by highlighting personal qualities they possess, which may be of great importance in their employment. Also, all agreed that there are more SwD in the faculties than they were reported in student services. The common conclusion was identification a need for creating a poster so that students can be known about certain benefits which they can achieve during their study process. That posters should be placed in the student services of the faculties of UES.

After these activities, the following conclusions were made:

1. Students with disabilities are grateful for this project, and the support they get through it.
2. SwD should contact the Pension and Disability Insurance Fund of RS in order to get the necessary documents about thier disability, which they submit when enrolling at the faculty. In this way they have the right to participate in this project and get certain benefits at the university guaranteed to them by the Act on Higher Education.
3. Adopt a law to regulate the status of persons with disabilities.
4. Motivational support to pupils with disabilities in high schools; enrollment at the faculties and ability to complete them successfully is something achievable.
5. Creation of special posters which task should be informing of SwD about their rights if they register (teachers and students have created one such poster, which is attached in this report).

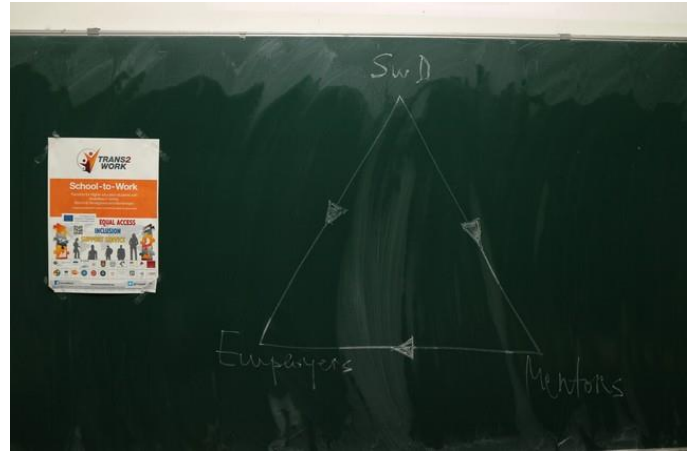
