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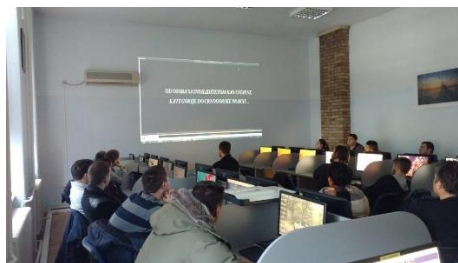
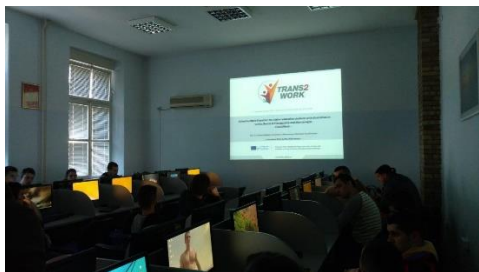
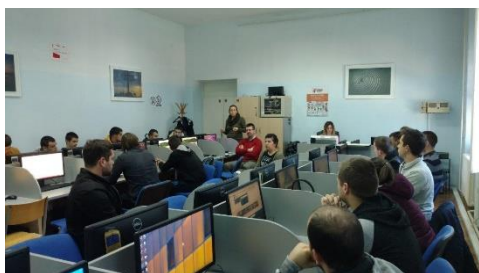
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as the mobility process for students with disabilities in Europe and the nearest environment.
