3. Introduction

The goals of dissemination activity, which was held on saturday, 6th of October, at the Faculty of Philosophy University of Sarajevo, was to:

- Present the Trans2Work Project and its results to academic staff, students and guests;
- Exchange of experiences in the context of the implemented student's mobility and internship: employers, students with disability, mentor and the participants of the Round table.

4. Short description of the activity

Participants were greeted by the faciltator and the member of Trans2Work UNSA team, professor Snježana Šušnjara. Then, the coordinator of Trans2Work UNSA team, professor Lejla Kafedžić, adressed to the participants pointing out that this dissemination activity is also the last one since the Project has successfully come to its end. She also mentioned students mobility and exchange as piloting of all project results.

Professor Lejla Hodžić shortly presented the Project, its importance and goals. She underlined achieved goals, specially the ones contributing to the infrastructure of support to the students with disability at University of Sarajevo, promoting inclusive education and creating inclusive environment.

Merima Zukić, as a mentor, talked about students mobility and SMS realization, its barriers, challenges and positive experiences of the activity.

The representatives of the employers, SwD exchange hosts, shared their satisfaction and positive experiences gained through realisation of SMS. They also stressed their readiness to paricipate in similair activities also in the future. The positive SMS effects appeared on personal as well as on professional level.

Student Amela Bojić, SMS participant, talked about her positive experience and impressions gained during her stay in Monte Negro. She mentioned how participation in SMS empowered and strenghtened her personality.

Panel discussion was dynamic and has shown great support of all participants to the idea of inclusive education and readiness to participate in similar future activities.
